Winter Weather for Monday and Tuesday

Highest Impacts on Tuesday

Key Messages


- → A large storm system will bring moderate to heavy precipitation to the region, including both rain and snow, along with gusty winds.
- → A Wind Advisory is in effect on Monday from 8 AM through 4 PM.
- → A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect on Tuesday from 6 AM through 6 PM.
- → Minor impacts are expected especially along and north of I-44. These may linger into Wednesday morning.

NEW Important Updates

→ A northern storm track is favoring snow totals at 1-3" along and north of I-44, with 0-1" along and south of I-44.

Synopsis



Hazards: Rain (potentially moderate to heavy) will move into southwest Missouri and southeast Kansas Monday morning. A transition to snow late Monday night into Tuesday is then favored. Additionally, brisk winds will pose a low to medium chance (30-50%) of blowing snow Tuesday.



Areas Impacted: The entire forecast area. The greatest probabilities (40-50%) for at least minor travel impacts are along and north of the I-44 corridor. Probabilities of moderate impacts are in the 5-10% range.



Timing & Duration: Monday morning through Tuesday night with impacts lasting into Wednesday morning.




Impacts: The Winter Storm Severity Index (WSSI) highlights minor impacts along and north of the I-44 corridor for Tuesday into Wednesday morning. These impacts are largely driven by blowing snow and freezing temperatures.



Certainty & Considerations: With a more northward system trajectory becoming most likely, confidence is increasing in lower snowfall amounts south of I-44 with totals up to 1-3" possible along and north of I-44.

Weather Outlook - Matrix

Highest Impacts Likely Monday through Tuesday



This outlook depicts timing and magnitude of potential impacts to local travel and infrastructure from snowfall rates and/or amounts, blowing snow, ice, and cold temperatures.

Potential aggravating factors such as time of day, pre-existing conditions, and holiday travel periods are also taken into consideration.

Blowing Snow & Freezing Temperatures




Key Message

A large storm system will bring rain and snow to the area Monday through Tuesday. The most impactful weather is expected north of I-44 with potential for minor impacts (yellow). Impacts are mainly due to **blowing snow** and **freezing temperatures**, with lower potential for impacts due to snowfall amounts.









Probability of > 2"of snowfall









Probabilistic Snowfall

Probability of > 6"of snowfall








Confidence Details

- → Confidence is highest in timing of this system, with rain moving into the area Monday morning before transitioning to a rain/snow mix or snow Monday night into Tuesday.
- → Confidence in the track of this system has increased, with a more northern trajectory looking most likely.
- → Confidence in rainfall and snow amounts is slowly increasing, but still moderate.

Alternate Scenarios

→ There is still a chance of a slightly southward track which would put snowfall amounts toward the higher end of the range.

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






Cooler Temperatures Ahead

- Much colder air arrives following the system Monday and Tuesday.
- 70-90% chance for below normal temperatures Jan. 13-17.
- Stay tuned to future forecasts for temperatures, wind chills, and potential impacts.

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Potential Winter Storm Impacts

Minor Impacts

Expect a few inconveniences to daily life.

Winter driving conditions. Use caution while driving.

Moderate Impacts

Expect disruptions to daily life.

- Hazardous driving conditions. Use extra caution while driving.
- Closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.

Major Impacts

Expect considerable disruptions to daily life.

- Dangerous or impossible driving conditions.
 Avoid travel if possible.
- Widespread closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.

Extreme Impacts

Expect substantial disruptions to daily life.

- Extremely dangerous or impossible driving conditions. Travel is not advised.
- Extensive and widespread closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.
- · Life-saving actions may be needed.
