

Winter Weather Today through Tuesday

Highest Impacts Monday and Tuesday

Key Messages


- → Two rounds of winter precipitation will move through the region this morning through Tuesday.
- → Today into Saturday: Precipitation will be a light mix of rain, snow, and drizzle. Little to no impacts are expected.
- → Monday & Tuesday: A large storm system will bring moderate to heavy precipitation to the region, including both rain and snow, along with gusty winds.

NEW Important Updates

→ There is low potential (5-15% chance) for freezing drizzle in the eastern Ozarks Friday evening/night

This outlook depicts timing and magnitude of potential impacts to local travel and infrastructure from snowfall rates and/or amounts, blowing snow, ice, and cold temperatures.

Potential aggravating factors such as time of day, pre-existing conditions, and holiday travel periods are also taken into consideration.

Friday and Saturday

Light Rain and Snow Mix



Hazards: Medium to high probabilities (30-70%) of a dusting of snow exist. Low potential for freezing drizzle (5-15% chance)



Areas Impacted: A few periods of light snow, rain, and drizzle from early Friday morning through Saturday night. Greatest chance of a dusting is south of I-44, greatest chance for drizzle is SE of the Ozark Plateau



Timing & Duration: Friday morning through Saturday night.



Impacts: Only a dusting of snow will occur along and west of I-49, with minimal impacts expected. Minor impacts could arise from freezing drizzle if it materializes.





More Impactful than Friday/Saturday Systems



Hazards: Rain (potentially moderate to heavy) will move into southwest Missouri and southeast Kansas Monday morning. A transition to snow Monday night into Tuesday is then favored. Additionally, brisk winds will pose a low chance (20-30%) of blowing snow.



Areas Impacted: The entire forecast area. The greatest probabilities (40-60%) for at least minor travel impacts are along and north of the I-44 corridor. Probabilities of moderate impacts are in the 20-30% range.



Timing & Duration: Monday morning through Tuesday afternoon.



Impacts: The Probabilistic Winter Storm Severity Index (P-WSSI) highlights a 40-60% chance of at least minor travel impacts and a 20-30% chance of moderate impacts.





Certainty & Considerations: It is too early for specific rain and/or snowfall totals, though the potential for higher-end impacts will continue to be monitored.



Confidence Details

- → Confidence is highest in timing of this system, with rain moving into the area Monday morning before transitioning to a rain and snow mix Monday night into Tuesday.
- → Confidence in the track of this system is still low.
- Confidence in rainfall and snow amounts remain low.

Alternate Scenarios

- → If the track of the system pushes further north, the chances for rain will increase.
- → If the track of the system pushes south, the chance for snow will increase.

Potential Winter Storm Impacts

Minor Impacts

Expect a few inconveniences to daily life.

Winter driving conditions. Use caution while driving.

Moderate Impacts

Expect disruptions to daily life.

- Hazardous driving conditions. Use extra caution while driving.
- Closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.

Major Impacts

Expect considerable disruptions to daily life.

- Dangerous or impossible driving conditions.
 Avoid travel if possible.
- Widespread closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.

Extreme Impacts

Expect substantial disruptions to daily life.

- Extremely dangerous or impossible driving conditions. Travel is not advised.
- Extensive and widespread closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.
- · Life-saving actions may be needed.
