

Strong to severe thunderstorms


This afternoon and tonight

Key Messages

→ Numerous showers and thunderstorms this afternoon (12 PM) through tonight (12 AM). There is a Slight (2/5) to Enhanced (3/5) risk for hail up to baseballs and wind gusts up to 70 mph. Low potential for localized flooding.





Thursday Severe Weather Outlook

Mainly Between Noon - Midnight

Key Points

- → Numerous showers and thunderstorms (60-80%) this afternoon (12 PM) through tonight (12 AM).
- → Hail up to golf ball size and wind gusts up to 70 mph. An isolated tornado possible.
- → Low potential for localized flooding.
- → The best chance for severe thunderstorms is along and south of the I-44 corridor.






