

Winter Storm Ahead this Weekend

Main Impacts from 6 PM Saturday to 6 AM Monday

Key Messages

- Winter Storm Watch in effect for portions of central \rightarrow Missouri and the eastern Ozarks and east central Kansas.
- Increasing confidence in an impactful wintry mix of \rightarrow freezing rain, sleet, and snow along with gusty winds.
- High confidence in well below normal temperatures \rightarrow next week.


Important Updates NEW

- Winter Storm Watch extended slight south and west \rightarrow through Monday Morning (6 AM).
- The area for rain has been expanded a bit further \rightarrow north.
- Potential to see a brief period of freezing drizzle \rightarrow Saturday morning/afternoon.

Watch Details




In effect from Saturday 6 PM through Monday Morning 6 AM.



Periods of heavy mixed precipitation will occur in the watch area at times from Saturday evening into Sunday night.

Total snow and sleet accumulations of 2 to 4 inches in the watch area with locally higher amounts up to 5 inches possible across portions of central Missouri.

Total ice accumulations around one tenth to a quarter-inch with locally higher amounts to around one half inch possible in the watch area.



Probability of > 2 inches of Snow and Sleet






Probability of > 6 inches of Snow and Sleet



Potential for greater than a tenth of an inch of ice



Potential for greater than one half of an inch of ice







Probabilistic Winter Storm Severity Index

Probabilistic WSSI





Confidence Levels

Location



Confidence Details

- There still remains uncertainty on the exact locations of wintry \rightarrow precipitation with large weather model ranges in snow and ice accumulations.
- The ultimate location of key features such as the freezing line \rightarrow will play key roles in eventual amounts.

Alternate Scenarios

- Warm air above the surface could shift farther north and result \rightarrow in more freezing rain than snow across central Missouri.
- Thunderstorms could result in heavy areas of sleet across the \rightarrow eastern Ozarks. This would locally reduce ice accumulations.
- The surface freezing line will be critical regarding eventual ice \rightarrow amounts.



Forecast Wind Gusts

Another concern from this storm system will be the combination of wind and ice accumulation. Power outages and tree damage are possible due to the ice, especially if higher localized amounts materialize. Travel may be dangerous.





Very Cold Ahead Next Week

Key Messages

- High confidence in well below normal \rightarrow temperatures next week.
- Temperatures 15 to 25 degrees below \rightarrow normal.
- Wind chills of 0 to -10 during the late \rightarrow night and early morning hours next week.
- Vulnerable populations should taken \rightarrow necessary precautions and put plans into action.




