

Major Storm System Friday


Strong Winds, Severe Storms, and Significant Fire Danger

Key Messages

- → Increasing severe thunderstorm risk from west to east on Friday, culminating in a Moderate (level 4 of 5) Risk in the far eastern Ozarks. Coverage remains in question.
- → Very windy Friday (outside of storms), with potentially widespread damaging winds of 50 60+ mph.
- → Low relative humidities again Friday, leading to widespread significant to extreme fire weather potential.

NEW What Has Changed

- Wind Advisory and High Wind Watch
- Fire Weather Watch






Severe Weather Potential on Friday

Monitor the Forecast

- If and where storms form, they move quickly. Severe weather is only expected through a short window of time (approx. 4 PM-10 PM Friday).
- Storms will move west to east, and severe risk increases to the east.
- Several different hazards may be possible with these storms.
- There is potential for many areas to remain dry, as models have trended lower in coverage.




Storm Window: 4 pm - 10 pm

Wind Probability


Tornado Probability

- All modes of severe weather are possible if and where thunderstorms can develop. Coverage and potential remains in question at this time.
- If thunderstorms can become established, large hail greater than 2", damaging winds greater than 75 mph, and tornadoes (some strong) would be possible in the hatched areas.





Wind Headlines



High Wind Watch: 10 AM - 8 PM Fri
Sustained 30-40 mph
Gusts up to 60+ mph

Wind Advisory: 10 AM Fri - 1 AM Sat Sustained 25-35 mph Gusts up to 55 mph

Impacts:

- Difficult driving, especially high profile vehicles
- Tree/powerline damage
- Possible power outages
- Loose objects blown around


High Wind Watch and Wind Advisory Friday





Wind Gusts Friday

Potential for higher wind gusts than what is shown here



- Sustained south to southwest winds between 30-40 mph with gusts up to 50-60 mph are expected on Friday.
- Infrequent gusts greater than 60 mph are possible.
- These winds will occur outside of any thunderstorms (gusts with any thunderstorms may be higher).
- For reference, 58 mph winds is the criteria for a Severe Thunderstorm Warning.

NWS Springfield Wind Headline Criteria

The difference between advisory, watch, and warning for wind products

Wind Advisory

Use Caution

Hazardous wind not associated with a thunderstorm is expected.

Sustained winds
≥ 30-40 mph
for an hour or more

and/or

Gusts of 45-58 mph for any duration

High Wind Watch

Be Prepared

There is a possibility of dangerous wind not associated with a thunderstorm in the next 24-48 hours.

Sustained winds
≥ 40 mph
for an hour or more

and/or

Gusts ≥ 58 mph for any duration

High Wind Warning

Take Action!

Dangerous wind not associated with a thunderstorm is imminent or expected within 18 hours.


Sustained winds

and/or

Gusts ≥ 58 mph for any duration

Fire Weather Watch on Friday

Fire Weather Watch: 10 AM - 1 AM Sat Relative humidity as low as 15-25% Winds 25-40 mph with gusts 55-60 mph


- Significant to extreme fire danger is expected Friday in areas covered by the Fire Weather Watch.
- This is due to very high winds and relative humidities of 15–25% as a dryline sweeps through the area.
- Fire control will be extremely difficult.
 Recent dry weather has already resulted in unusual fire spread and behavior this week.


Any burning is strongly discouraged!

Signal for fire weather conditions to continue this weekend into next week







Fire Danger Next Week
