## Key Messages

- **Marginal (1 of 5)** severe risk for isolated strong to severe thunderstorms this afternoon and into tonight.
- Damaging wind gusts of 60 to 70 mph is the primary hazard, with large hail up to quarter size being the secondary hazard.
- Marginal (1 of 4) risk for localized heavy rainfall.

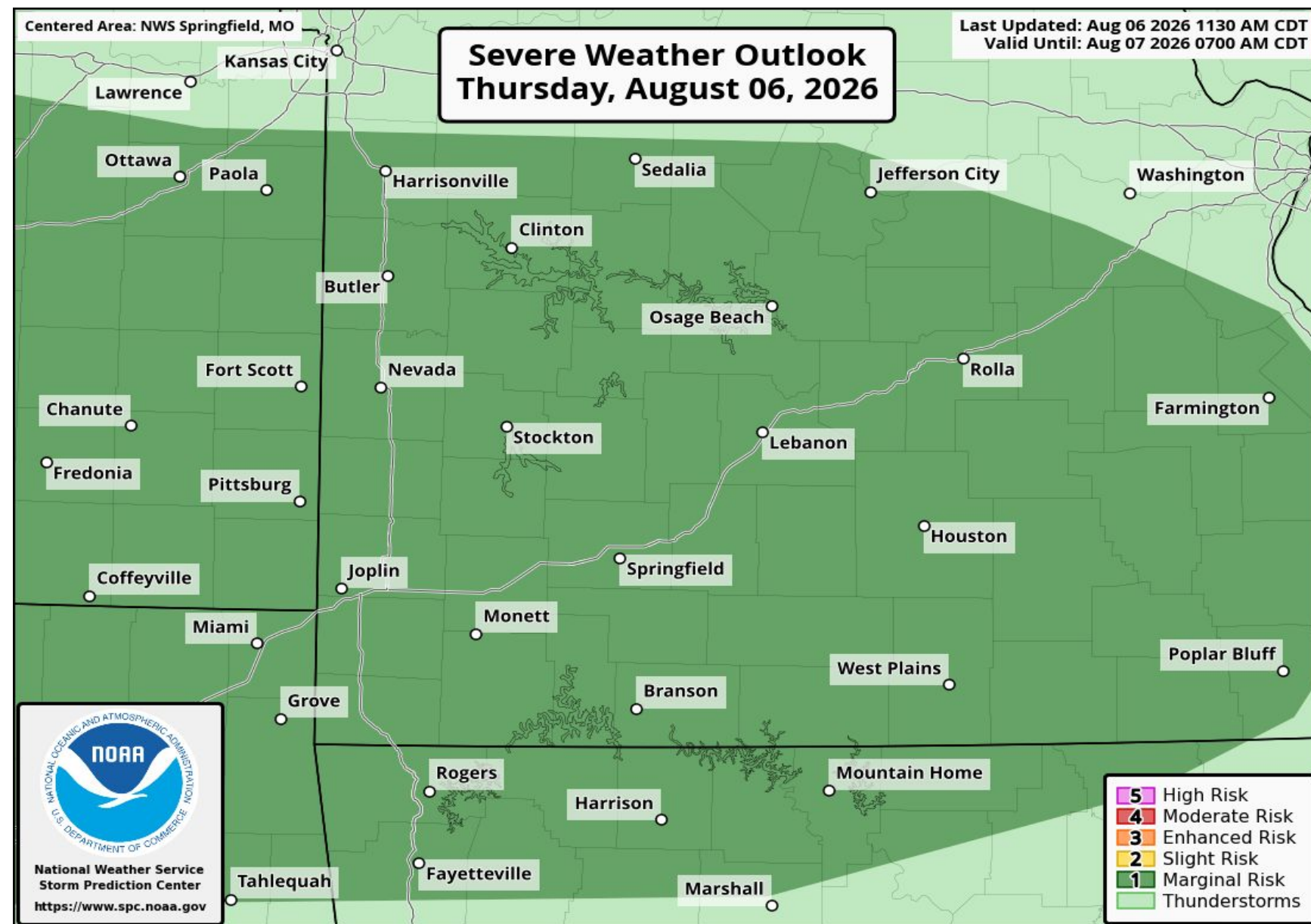

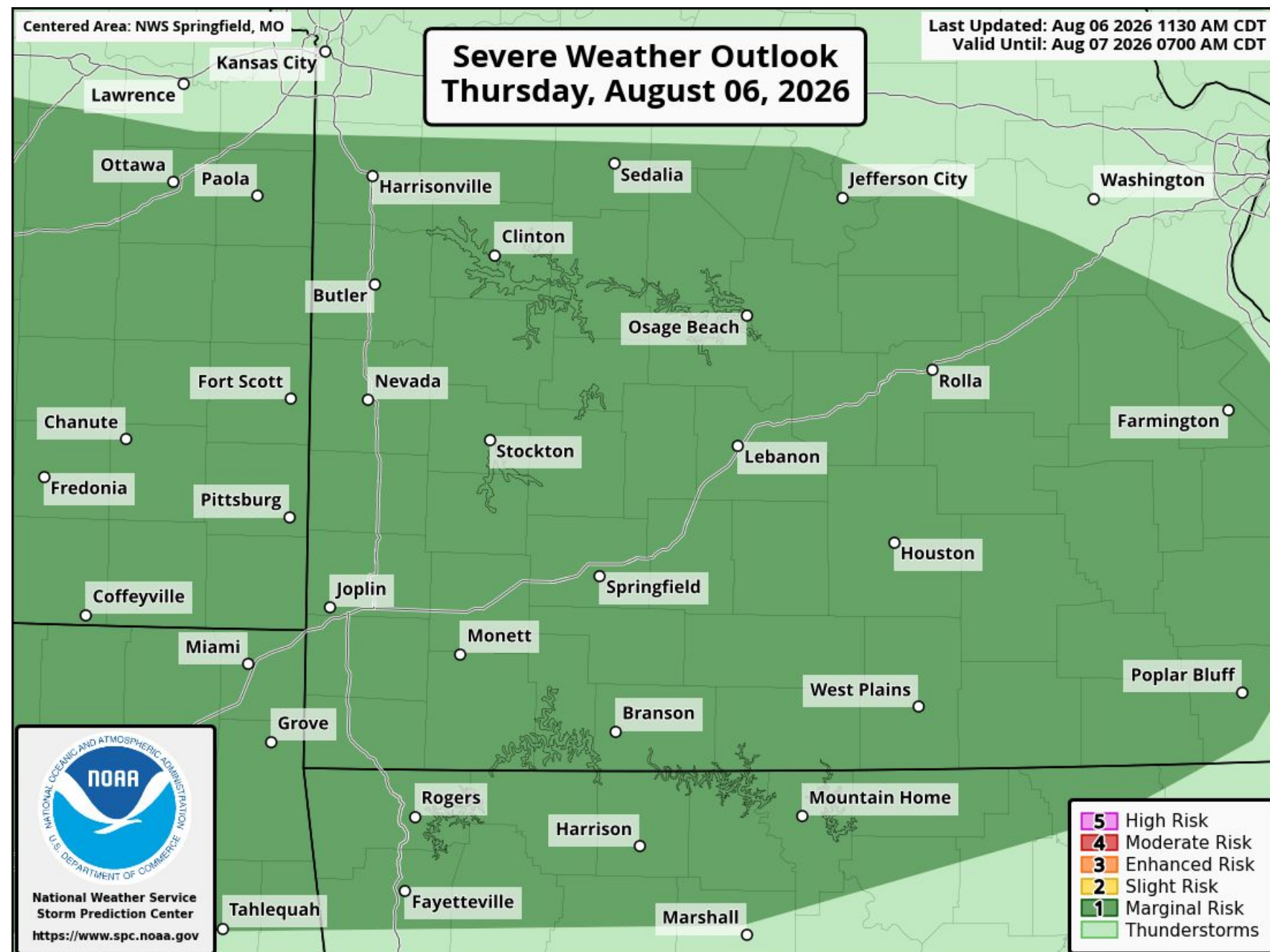
# Severe Thunderstorm Outlook

August 6, 2026  
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This Afternoon and Tonight

## Key Messages

- **Marginal (1 of 5)** severe risk for isolated strong to severe thunderstorms this afternoon through tonight.
- **This Afternoon-Evening:** Isolated pop-up thunderstorms this afternoon into this evening, capable of producing damaging wind gusts of 60-70 mph and quarter sized hail.
- **Tonight:** Scattered thunderstorms tonight into Friday morning, with a few line segments or embedded thunderstorms capable of producing damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph.
- Storms are expected to be isolated to scattered, so exact locations are uncertain and many areas may remain dry.
- Storms could occur at anytime between 3 PM today and 7 AM Friday morning, with a focus for best severe potential between 4 and 10 PM.

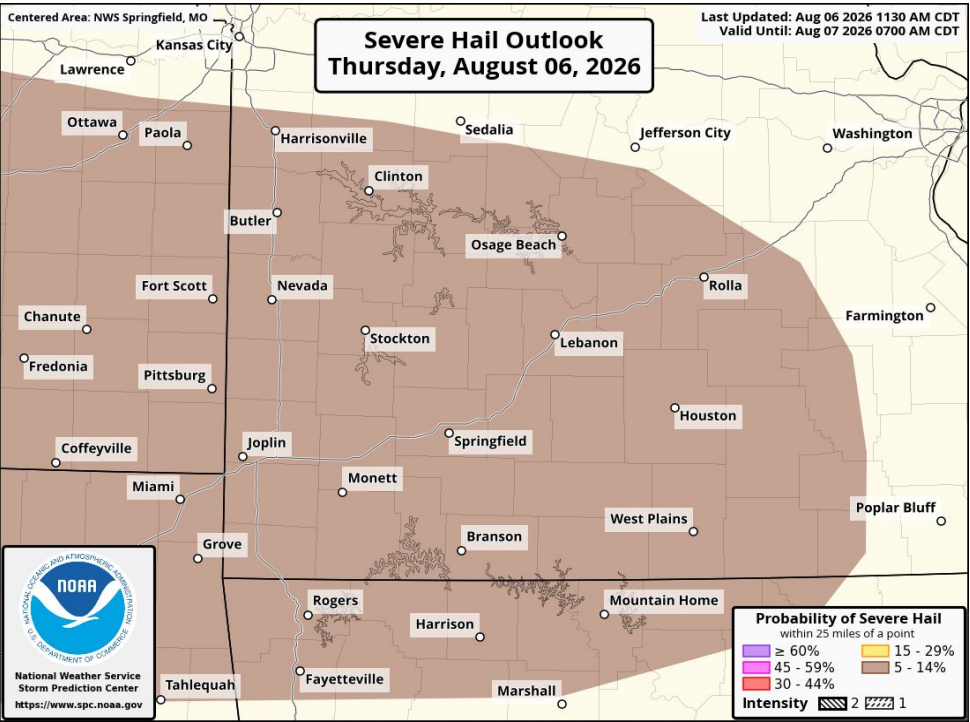

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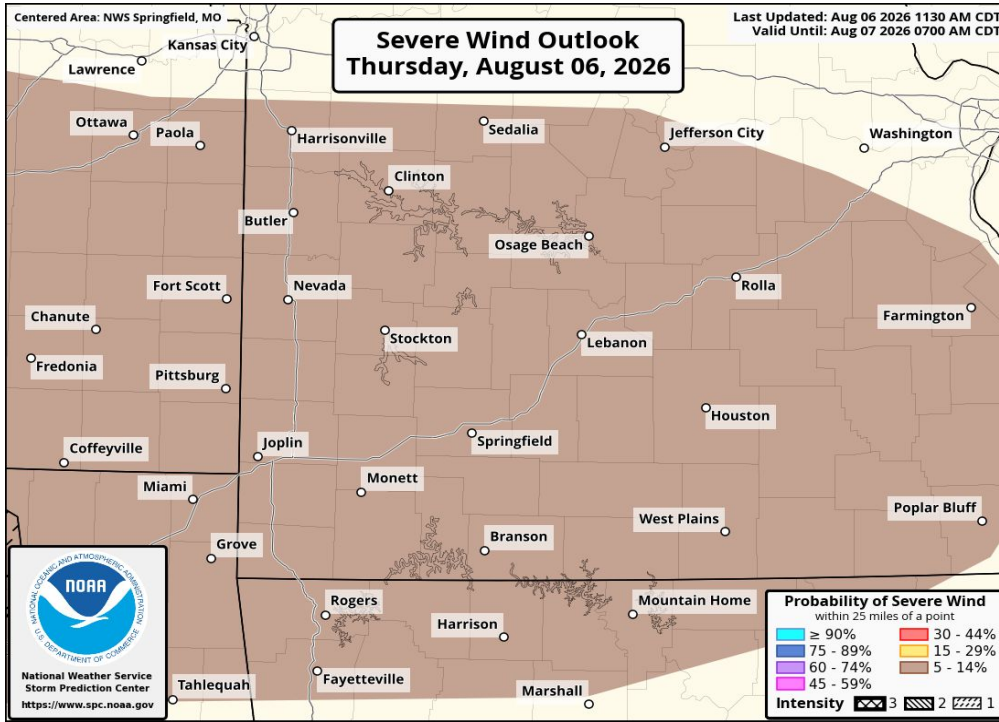

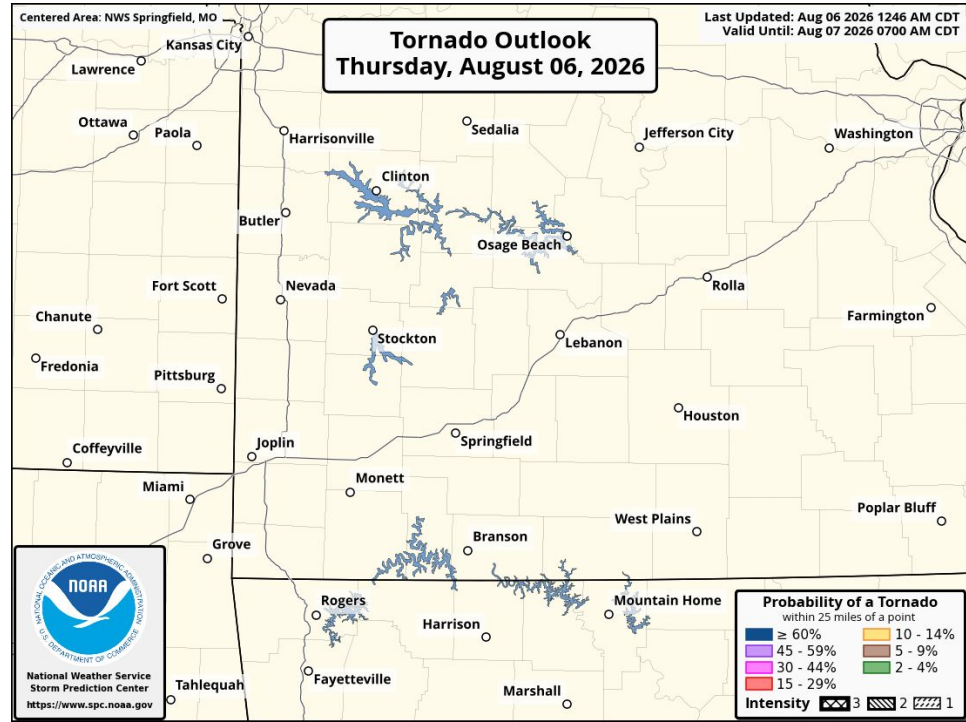
## Hail Probability

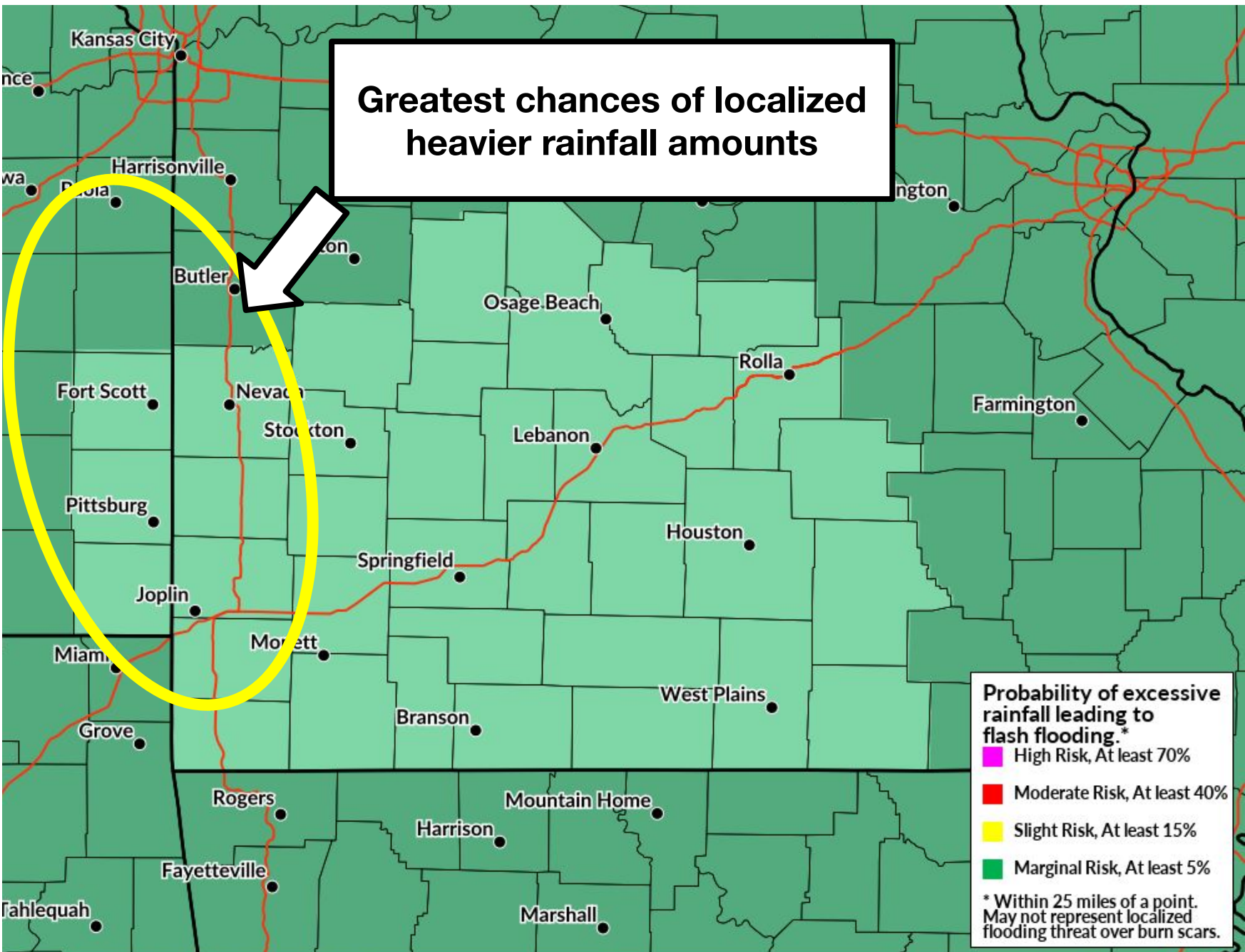
# Potential for Localized Heavy Rainfall

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This Afternoon and Tonight

## Key Messages

- **Marginal (1 of 4)** risk for localized heavy rainfall.
- Most locations that see thunderstorms will see around 0.25 to 0.50 inch of rainfall.
- Localized heavier amounts of 1 to 3 inches where repeated thunderstorms track over the same area. This may result in a few instances of flash flooding.
- Some locations may remain completely dry through tonight.
